Painting Stobie Poles

Seat With A View

For some time this association has been negotiating with the City of Marion to put a seat at the top of the hill and looking over the Wetlands. We feel that this would be an extremely pleasant place to spend some time relaxing with a view.

The Friends of the Sturt River Group has lately planted this area and is concerned that the young plants could be damaged.

With this in mind we have arranged with City of Marion staff to buy the seat and store it ready for installation when the plants have matured. It was agreed that planting would be developed in such a way that the view would be enhanced with low lying shrubs down the hill.

Recycling Station

Another initiative still in discussion is the possibility of establishing a couple of small recycling stations around the Estate for items that cannot be recycled through your yellow kerbside recycling bin. Rather than keep old batteries in the cupboard until you have enough to take to a large recycling station a collection point for the Estate is being contemplated. MARION HISTORIC VILLAGE www.marionvillagemuseum.com.au

Located a short distance from us on the Oaklands Estate there is a wonderful opportunity to take an easy one hour walk of approximately 2 kms – the Marion Historic Village Heritage Walk commences at the Marion Historic Village Museum in Township Road (behind Wesleyan Chapel) and includes historic sites such as Light Square, Annie Doolan’s Cottage, Laurel Cottage and the Old Marion Inn



On this walk each historic site has a tiled marker with a two-tone concrete ‘survey line’ crossing the footpath. The survey lines refer to the laying out of the Village of Marion by Light, Finnis & Co.



As facilitators of the Marion Heritage Walk, the Museum has acquired a state of the art Audio Tour Guide system and has made this equipment available on guided walks booked through the Museum. Check the website for details on how to book or get a brochure and do the walk in your own time.

How often have you driven down Finnis Street and seen the *Little Marion* sculptures. The sculptures were created by Gerry McMahon and are based on local resident Margaret Western’s recollections and stories of growing up in the village. Want to find out more? The Museum is open every Sunday between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. or Tuesdays 10 am to 12 noon.

We continue to be indebted to David Jarman for his publication “The History of Oaklands” telling the story about the inhabitants and their life on what is now the Oaklands Estate Reserve. Copies of this fabulous read can be purchased from Marion Council office.

WETLANDS UPDATE

The following update has been provided by the Water Resources Coordinator at the City of Marion. So much happens behind the scenes to keep this area we now take for granted in top shape!

“Over the last month or so Marion Council staff members have established additional plants in the Wetlands to replace the plants destroyed by foraging birds, and will continue to do this. Next Spring additional sandy loam will be imported to encourage more plants to spread.



Recently the Wetlands were emptied to enable removal of pest fish. This included catching thousands of mosquitofish and dozens of carp and redfin, plus some exotic species like a 26cm Rainbow Trout. Native fish, turtles and yabbies were rescued and will be returned as the wetlands is filled back up over this coming week, as it has started raining again.

Whilst the ponds were empty repairs and cleaning of the storm water drains were undertaken.

Recently some sand filters were installed to help keep the water tanks next to the pump shed free of sand that gets lifted from the aquifer.

It is hoped an extension to the distribution network further south into Seacliff and Marion Park Golf Club on Ocean Boulevard can be done.”

The transformation of the former Road Safety Centre site to Wetlands has been an enormous and very successful project.

End of Financial Year Property Update
